Learning to Thrive: Empowering children with care and freedom

It was a rainy morning when a parent was called to the school office to discuss and understand her child's growing absenteeism. The school had observed not only frequent absences but also a concerning shift in the child's behavior-withdrawal, lethargy, and a lack of engagement in school activities. Once a curious and active seventh-



grade learner, the child now seemed disconnected, prompting the school to take a proactive approach in uncovering the reasons behind these changes.

"Please feel at ease. This meeting isn't about any complaints; it's to understand the reasons behind the changes we've noticed in his behavior. I want to ensure we work together to support him." reassured the principal.

That simple act of being fully present created space for an open conversation. What followed wasn't just a list of concerns-it was a path that needed to be understood. The parent shared how her child, once curious and active, was now returning home visibly drained. As the conversation unfolded, the child's daily routine came into focus: after-school hours filled with back-to-back classes, barely leaving time to rest, play, or reflect.

The child was overwhelmed-not just by the schedule, but by the growing belief that he wasn't capable enough. He began to question himself, wondering if he could ever meet expectations. Frustration took over, leading to late submissions, emotional outbursts, and less engagement in class. The final blow came when the child was asked to step away from the school football team-the one thing that still sparked joy-because it was seen as a distraction by the parent.

But something changed that day in the principal's office. Just listening with care and conveying, "I'm here for you," made it easier for both the child and the parent to speak openly. With trust and kindness, the conversation became the first step toward finding a better way forward.

I followed up with a one-on-one conversation with the child. Together, we explored a simple yet powerful question: What if learning didn't have to feel this way? Could he try new methods? Could he reach out to teachers at school for help? Could he design a study routine that made sense for him?

A joint meeting with the parent and child followed, where we discussed how learning can become fun, meaningful, and connected-when we take ownership and give ourselves permission to experiment with how we learn. It wasn't about piling on more-it was about tuning in to what works, what excites, and what helps the child feel in control. I requested one thing from the parent-to hold off on any extra tuition unless the child genuinely felt the need,

after exploring and experimenting with self-study.

We talked about self-study, different ways to revise and reflect, and the importance of asking for help when needed. The child responded with curiosity and energy-ready to try, to explore, and to shape his own learning journey.

Over the next few months, the teacher, child, and parent engaged in regular follow-ups, each contributing to a deeper understanding of one another. These interactions, rooted in active listening and mutual support, allowed everyone to stay involved and aligned in the child's progress-fostering an environment where the child felt heard, understood, and empowered to move forward.

The parent later shared : "We've seen such a shift-in how he talks about school, how he tries different ways to learn, and how proud he feels of what he is doing."

Behind every concern is a child looking to be understood. When we listen deeply and work together-not just to support, but to empower-we unlock more than progress in learning. We reignite a love for learning.

Because when children own their learning-when they're encouraged to try different pathslearning becomes something more than a task: it becomes an adventure.

Sometimes, all it takes is someone to ask: "What would learning look like if it felt just right for you?" And then, to listen-with heart.

Ananya, a gifted young artist who brings canvases to life with her creativity. Painting gives her joy and a sense of purpose, yet she hesitates to embrace her talent fully because she feels pressured to prioritize academics. She frequently hears, "Art won't pay the bills." The fear of disappointing her family makes her question whether pursuing her passion is worthwhile.

These stories reflect a common dilemma among students—being caught between personal aspirations and societal expectations. The pressure to conform can lead to anxiety, self-doubt, and a loss of individuality. While parental guidance is invaluable, it is equally important to recognize that success is not limited to conventional career paths. Every student possesses unique talents and strengths, which deserve encouragement and nurturing.

At Rasbihari International School, this simple proverb comes alive in our Atal Tinkering Lab, where young minds turn everyday problems into exciting possibilities. Here, students are not just learning facts — they are learning to think, create, and solve.



It all begins with curiosity. Our students look around and wonder: What can we do to make life better for others? They notice waste piling up in neighbourhoods, farmers struggling with falling crop yields, the choking effects of pollution, and the hardships faced by workers in dangerous mining areas. 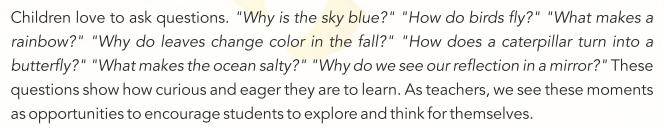
It's okay not to know The Beauty of Curiosity

Mast. Gokul's journey: From anger to empathy

At the beginning of the school year, Gokul was a little boy with big emotions and an even bigger wall built around him. His days were often filled with angry outbursts—shouting, hitting, and refusing to take part in classroom activities. He wouldn't listen to teachers, avoided working with peers, and often stood alone, disconnected from the classroom around him.

Worried about his behaviour, we referred Gokul to the school counsellor. Observations confirmed what we had already begun to sense: he was struggling deeply—not only with academics but with expressing his emotions, making friends, and feeling safe enough to be vulnerable.

He lashed out frequently, not just at classmates but even at teachers and support staff. He rarely completed any tasks, and when it came to group work, he was always on the outside looking in.

So, we began.....,

Understanding Gokul

One-on-one counselling sessions slowly began to peel back the layers. Through these talks, I discovered something essential— Gokul wasn't just acting out; he genuinely believed that whatever he asked for *must* be fulfilled, or he would spiral into anger. Once we understood the root of his behaviour, we could finally start helping him change.

I introduced a simple but powerful technique: placing his hand on his chest and slowly counting to ten. In the beginning, he resisted. But over time, he started using this calming method—not just for himself, but also to support a classmate named Abhijit when he got upset. It was a beautiful moment the first time Gokul walked over to Abhijit and said, "Let's count together."

Play, Expression, and Care

We also used toys and clay during guided playtime to help Gokul express his feelings in non-verbal ways. These moments gave him space to explore emotions that were once too big to name.

I began noticing small signs of his caring nature—he'd help classmates carry their tiffin boxes, offer to tidy up, and assist friends who were struggling. Behind the outbursts was a heart that truly cared for others. He just didn't know how to show it yet.

Support in the Classroom

We rolled out strategies in class, too.

Gokul thrived under encouragement, so we created a reward system that celebrated even small wins—like finishing handwriting practice or raising his hand to share something in class. I gave him chances to speak in front of the class and always made sure he was placed in groups where he could form new friendships.

It worked. Slowly but surely, Gokul began to open up to his peers. He started talking, then playing, then laughing with them.

The Shift Begins

After three months, the difference in Gokul was undeniable.

His aggressive episodes had dropped significantly. When upset, he would now cry instead of hitting—a huge emotional leap. He started to express his feelings using words, and his confidence in the classroom began to bloom.

He began completing tasks, especially when encouraged by his teachers and classmates. His reading showed progress with letter recognition and basic blending of sounds, and his writing—though not perfect—was now something he attempted willingly. He even turned little things into games: whenever we mentioned a competition, he'd light up, count "1-2-3" out loud, and jump into action.

Gokul participated in a rhyme competition and shared a story with some guidance. His voice, once loud with anger, was now full of curiosity and creativity.

Where He Stands Today

Gokul has blossomed into a kind, helpful member of the class. He comforts peers when they're upset and proudly completes tasks with growing independence. Though his attention span is still short, his progress is steady and inspiring.

He now sings rhymes, reads with support, and writes more confidently. More importantly, he has learned to express himself not with fists or frustration—but with words, actions, and empathy.

Conclusion

Gokul's journey from an angry, withdrawn child to a caring, involved student is a testament to the power of patience, understanding, and early intervention. Through targeted counselling, play-based learning, and classroom support, Gokul has taken his first big steps toward emotional resilience.

His story reminds us all: every child has the potential to grow—and with the right support, even the toughest beginnings can lead to beautiful transformations.

The Power of personalised support in Learning: A Case for every Child's Success

A young child, full of energy but struggling quietly in the classroom. Rahul, a student who stepped into the classroom with uncertainty, faced challenges that many might consider daunting: limited vocabulary, difficulty understanding spoken English, and trouble completing even basic tasks. But his story doesn't end there, because with the right approach, support, and encouragement, Rahul began to transform. His journey illustrates how essential personalized attention is for every child in overcoming their struggles and unlocking their potential.

When Rahul first entered the classroom, he had a hard time even answering simple questions. His vocabulary was minimal, and his understanding of basic letters and sounds was limited. He needed constant repetition and guidance just to get through the day. This is where many students, like Rahul, fall behind if they don't receive the support they need—especially when the focus is on group learning without recognizing the individual needs of each student. The truth is, a child who struggles with fundamental skills can quickly lose confidence and fall behind if not given the right tools to succeed.

This is why personalized, one-on-one attention is so crucial. I realized Rahul needed more than just regular classroom instruction. He needed tailored interventions and hands-on methods that would cater specifically to his learning style. I began sitting beside him during lessons, gently guiding him and offering consistent feedback. I introduced visual aids, flashcards, and videos to reinforce vocabulary and sounds. By focusing on his strengths and breaking down complex tasks into manageable steps, Rahul started to make progress. It wasn't just about completing worksheets; it was about providing Rahul with tools that worked for him—tools that transformed the way he engaged with learning.

The key takeaway here is that traditional methods often fail to address the individual needs of students. We cannot expect every child to thrive in the same environment, at the same pace, or with the same approach. Rahul, like many students, needed activities that were engaging and interactive, ones that would help him visualize and better understand concepts. His learning process wasn't about forcing him to catch up to the rest of the class; it was about meeting him where he was and gradually building his confidence through personalized support.

For writing, we used hands-on activities like clay and dotted worksheets. For math, we worked with manipulatives, making numbers tangible and fun. These weren't just teaching strategies; they were ways to engage Rahul in his own learning process. It's clear that a child like Rahul can be helped with these small but meaningful interventions. When we personalize learning, we provide students with the opportunity to experience success on their terms.

Moreover, every success, no matter how small, was celebrated. It's crucial to build a child's self-esteem, especially when they have been struggling. In Rahul's case, each milestone—whether it was reading a new word or forming a letter correctly—was celebrated with stars, stamps, and praise. This positive reinforcement not only encouraged Rahul to keep trying but also showed him that his efforts were recognized and valued.

Rahul's story underscores the power of support classes and individual attention. But beyond the classroom, the involvement of his parents was equally important. Regular communication with his family ensured that Rahul was getting the support he needed at home, and it was through consistent feedback that we were able to fine-tune his learning plan. When his father joined the

conversation, I emphasized the importance of support classes, which Rahul began to attend. The effect was immediate—Rahul made more progress in those few sessions than he had in the previous months without that additional support.

We understand, Rahul's story is a testament to what can happen when we prioritize personalized learning and consistent support. With patience, targeted interventions, and a focus on the individual needs of each child, we can ensure that every student could have the opportunity to succeed. Rahul's progress is proof that no matter where a child starts, they can reach their full potential with the right guidance and encouragement.

In today's diverse classrooms, it's imperative that we recognize the unique challenges each child faces and provide the support they need to overcome them. As educators, parents, and community members, it is our responsibility to create learning environment where every child, like Rahul, has the chance to thrive. Let's work together to ensure that every student gets the personalized learning experience they deserve—because when we invest in each child's growth, we're investing in a brighter future for all.

Radhika's Story: From silent challenges to shining success

When Radhika first stepped into my classroom, she was a quiet, reserved seven-year-old who rarely made eye contact. She sat at her desk silently, unsure of herself, barely speaking to anyone around her. It was clear from the start that Radhika was carrying more than just a school bag—she carried the weight of past difficulties.

Radhika could only recognize a handful of letters and found it difficult to read even two-letter words. Her handwriting was scattered and uneven—letters often reversed, and she struggled to stay within the four-lined paper. But what stood out most wasn't her academic difficulty; it was her lack of confidence. She hesitated to speak, rarely joined conversations, and distanced herself from her classmates.

Her parents explained that her previous school had not been able to give her the individual support she needed, and as a result, she had fallen behind. But from the moment she entered my classroom, I knew that with the right support, patience, and encouragement, Radhika had the potential to thrive.

Building a Safe Space for Learning

We began our journey gently. During our Tuesday and Wednesday support classes, I introduced phonics in playful, engaging ways—through colorful flashcards, cheerful songs, and interactive games. We repeated letter sounds daily, practiced blending them into words, and used visual aids to build connections. Her eyes lit up when she could finally read a simple word all by herself.

To help with reading, I used simple storybooks, sight words, and short sentence reading practice. I also showed her videos to reinforce phonics visually and aurally. Slowly, she began reading short sentences aloud—timidly at first, then with growing confidence. I made sure to cheer for her, no matter how small the step, and gave her space to read comfortably during our one-on-one

remedial sessions.

From Tracing to Writing with Confidence

Writing was another hurdle we tackled with creativity. To make it less intimidating, I introduced fun tactile activities—tracing letters in sand, writing in the air, and using clay to form alphabets. I provided lined worksheets for handwriting practice, and we worked together on improving letter formation and spacing. I gently corrected mistakes while always celebrating her effort. Each improvement, no matter how small, became a reason to celebrate. Stickers, claps, kind words—these small gestures became the foundation of her growing self-belief.

Helping Her Find Her Voice

Radhika's hesitation to talk to peers was a barrier that needed just as much attention as her academics. So I paired her with kind, encouraging classmates during group activities. Being surrounded by supportive peers in a safe space helped her slowly open up. She started answering questions in class, speaking more during activities, and smiling more often.

I made it a point to acknowledge and appreciate her not just privately, but in front of her classmates. Whether she read a new word or wrote a neat sentence, we celebrated it together. Slowly but surely, the shy little girl began to believe in herself.

Partnership with Parents

Her parents were key partners in her growth. I kept them informed regularly and shared simple ways they could help—reading short stories together at home, practicing letter formation, or even just listening as she tried to read aloud. Their support, even in small ways, added consistency to her learning.

A Remarkable Transformation

Over time, Radhika blossomed. She went from recognizing a few letters to reading simple sentences with confidence. Her handwriting improved dramatically—no more backward letters, and neatness became her new norm. She started raising her hand in class, participating in discussions, and making new friends. The transformation was not just academic—it was personal. The quiet, hesitant child was now a confident learner with a bright smile and a growing sense of belonging.

Conclusion

Watching Radhika grow was one of the most rewarding parts of my teaching journey. Her story is a beautiful reminder that when a child is seen, supported, and celebrated, they begin to see themselves as capable and worthy. With a safe space, patient guidance, and consistent encouragement, Radhika found her voice—and now, she's using it to learn, to laugh, and to shine.

"Empowering Keertana:

Overcoming Math Challenges Through Personalized Support"

Keertana, is a student in 3rd Red who faced several challenges in math. Initially, she struggled with solving word problems in addition and subtraction, finding it difficult to determine whether to add or subtract in each problem. Additionally, Keertana had trouble recalling multiplication tables, which slowed her down when working on multiplication and division problems. She also found the concepts of carrying over in addition and borrowing in subtraction challenging, often making mistakes in these areas.

Despite repeated classroom explanations and practice, Keertana did not complete extra practice worksheets or homework consistently, which impacted her ability to retain the concepts she had learned. Even when she understood a topic in class, she often forgot the steps after a few days, requiring frequent repetition and teaching.

Identified Challenges:

- 1. Word Problems: Keertana struggled to identify whether addition or subtraction was required in word problems.
- 2. Multiplication Tables: She had difficulty recalling multiplication tables, which hindered her ability to complete multiplication and division problems.
- 3. Carrying Over and Borrowing: Keertana made errors when performing addition with carrying over and subtraction with borrowing, two fundamental concepts in math.
- 4. Inconsistent Practice: Even with extra practice worksheets and homework, Keertana did not complete her practice assignments regularly, which affected her retention and application of concepts.
- 5. Short-Term Retention: Even after understanding a topic in class, she would forget the steps, needing constant revision.

Interventions and Strategies:

1. Hands-on Activities:

To address her difficulties with carrying over and borrowing, I introduced base-ten blocks and place value charts. These hands-on tools helped Keertana visualize the concepts, and she began making fewer mistakes in these areas.

2. Visual and Oral Techniques for Multiplication:

Recognizing Keertana's difficulty in recalling multiplication tables, I introduced techniques like skip counting and using her fingers to help her memorize the tables. This approach worked particularly well for tables of 2, 3, and 5, which she started recalling more fluently.

3. Structured Word Problem Breakdown:

I began breaking down word problems into smaller steps, emphasizing keywords that indicated whether to add or subtract. This strategy helped Keertana gain more confidence and reduced her confusion when solving word problems.

4. Peer Support and Encouragement:

I paired Keertana with a peer who was confident in solving word problems. However, this approach

did not yield much improvement on its own. Keertana required more structured guidance and personalized support to truly benefit from peer assistance.

5. Daily Practice and Revision:

I encouraged Keertana to revise multiplication tables daily, incorporating oral recitations and small quizzes to reinforce her recall. I also provided extra practice worksheets with a focus on place value operations and word problems. This repetitive practice helped her gradually build confidence and accuracy.

Progress over time:

Keertana has shown steady progress in the following areas:

- Addition and Subtraction: She now commits fewer errors in carrying over and borrowing, as the visual aids have helped her better understand these processes.
- Multiplication Tables: Keertana has started recalling the tables of 2, 3, and 5 with more fluency, though she still has challenges with higher numbers.
- Word Problems: She can now independently solve simple word problems but still requires assistance with more complex ones.
- Error Checking: One noticeable improvement is that Keertana has developed the habit of checking her answers before submitting, which has significantly reduced her mistakes.
- ❖ Confidence: Perhaps the most important change is her increased confidence in math. Keertana now approaches sums with a more positive attitude and is willing to attempt problems rather than skipping them.

Next Steps:

Moving forward, I plan to:

- 1. Reinforce Multiplication Tables: Continue using interactive games to make multiplication more engaging and help Keertana recall higher multiplication tables.
- 2. Daily Quick Revision: Provide daily, brief revision sessions to help Keertana reinforce problem-solving steps and ensure better retention.
- 3. Smaller, Manageable Tasks: Assign smaller, more manageable practice tasks that will encourage consistent practice without overwhelming her.
- 4. Weekly Progress Monitoring: Continuously track Keertana's progress through regular assessments and feedback, adjusting strategies as necessary to ensure continued improvement.

Conclusion:

Keertana's journey in mathematics has been one of steady growth. With structured support, hands-on activities, and consistent practice, she has overcome many of her initial challenges. Her increased confidence and ability to solve problems independently are significant milestones in her learning journey. Keertana's progress highlights the importance of personalized attention, patience, and the child centered strategies in helping a student build a strong foundation in math.

When Nihal walked into Grade 4, his confidence spoke for him. At just nine years old, he had a spark in his voice, a strong grip on English conversation, and a quick grasp of classroom instructions. He spoke fluently and eagerly, always ready to share his thoughts. But behind this confident exterior were a few quiet struggles—some with reading, some with writing, and others that showed up in the way he managed his emotions.

Nihal could read simple sentences fluently, but longer texts, trickier words, and complex instructions would often leave him puzzled. Writing, too, was a challenge. His thoughts didn't always make it clearly on paper—his handwriting was messy and hard to read. Even more concerning was how easily frustration took over. If things didn't go his way, Nihal's mood would shift in seconds—his fists clenched, his face tightened, and sometimes, his anger would spill out into hurtful words or actions.

This wasn't just something seen in class—his parents, too, shared that similar behaviors occurred at home. He would get into arguments with friends and become physically aggressive during disagreements.

But this story isn't just about challenges—it's about change.

The First Steps

In August, Nihal began attending remedial classes for English reading. Slowly, the fog began to lift. He started reading more fluently and confidently. His parents joined the effort too, agreeing to support his handwriting practice at home.

To better understand and support him, a meeting was held with the class teacher and the school's principal. His parents opened up about his anger issues and the difficulties they were facing. That conversation led to a new idea—a self-assessment checklist that Nihal would use at home to reflect on his behavior and build self-awareness.

Inspired by this, a behavior checklist was introduced at school as well. It focused on key behaviors: communicating respectfully, following instructions, avoiding inappropriate language, managing emotions, showing empathy, and staying engaged in learning tasks. Every day, Nihal's progress was recorded—once before lunch and again after. Feedback was gathered from teachers, peers, and staff, and something interesting began to happen...

Nihal started noticing that people were paying attention—not just to his mistakes, but also to his efforts. He began trying. He started speaking more politely to teachers, became friendlier with classmates, and slowly, he learned to pause and think before reacting. The checklist wasn't just a tool—it became his mirror.

Support Beyond the Classroom

Nihal wasn't alone on this journey. School Counselors played an important role in guiding him through his emotions. They would drop into class, chat with Nihal during recess, check on whether he'd eaten his lunch, or simply sit beside him during difficult moments. These little gestures began to add up.

The anger had flared again. After talking to the karate teacher and Nihal, it was evident he was still learning how to manage difficult emotions.

He was gently reminded that every action had an impact—that his behavior checklist was not just a school tool but a reflection of how he was growing. He listened, and slowly nodded, understanding that feelings do come and can pop up often, but response comes from what we do next.

A Journey in Progress

Today, Nihal is calmer. He reads better. His handwriting has improved. He is more aware of his emotions and how they affect others. He speaks more respectfully, works better with peers, and his once-frequent outbursts are now few and far between.

There's still more to learn—for all of us. But what stands out most is Nihal's willingness to change. He has started taking responsibility. He reflects. He listens. He tries again. And with the continued support of his teachers, counselors, and family, Nihal's story is no longer just about challenges. It's a story of transformation, patience, and hope.

Because every child, when seen and supported, can write their own beautiful story of their journey.

Finding Confidence, One Step at a Time

Manoj is a thoughtful and gentle learner in Grade 5, who, despite facing many learning challenges, has always shown a quiet eagerness to improve. Reading fluently, spelling correctly, understanding grammar, and framing proper sentences have been ongoing struggles for him. But behind those difficulties lies a student who never gives up.

When I first began working with Manoj, I noticed that even simple reading tasks were overwhelming for him. Reading three-letter words was difficult, and the connection between letters and sounds wasn't quite clear to him. So, we went back to the basics—phonics and blends. I introduced him to phonics through engaging videos and encouraged him to repeat each sound. We practiced blends together, and slowly, he began to decode words with a new level of understanding.

To build his fluency, we read aloud — he would repeat after me. Sometimes, we listened to audiobooks together, helping him follow along with the text. This multi-sensory approach began to pay off. His reading speed improved, and most importantly, his confidence grew. And as his understanding of phonics improved, his spelling began to improve too — especially with common sight words. Though he still finds longer 4–5 letter words tricky, he's learned to break them into syllables and apply rules more independently.

Writing full sentences was another mountain to climb. At first, Manoj would mix up word order or forget key parts of a sentence. We started practicing sentence structure with flashcards, pictures, and objects. I made sure to give him opportunities to write about things he loved — his favorite food, cartoons, or weekend plans. This gave him motivation, even if the results were still a work in progress. I explained subject-verb agreement rules and gave plenty of examples. Slowly, he began to see how sentences should come together.

Barriers along the Way

One of the biggest hurdles in Manoj's journey wasn't just the academic content — it was his irregular attendance. Despite our best efforts in class, his learning would take a step back every time he missed a support session. A parent meeting was held, and while his family admitted they were unable to support him much at home, they agreed to make a better effort in ensuring his attendance.

Together with the school's special educator, we created a customized plan. Lower-level worksheets and targeted strategies were prepared, and special sessions were arranged for him. However, Manoj only attended a few. I kept sharing feedback with his parents, but the inconsistency made it difficult for him to connect each class what he was learning.

To bridge the gaps, I started giving him additional support grammar worksheets and comprehension passages. I even created a weekly grammar practice session for him. A simpler grammar book was sent home to practice, but often the practice work remained incomplete. Without regular follow-up, these concepts would fade away.

The Turning Point

Despite the ups and downs, a turning point came when we introduced the buddy system in class. Paired with a supportive peer, Manoj found someone to encourage him, guide him, and even remind him to complete his classwork. He felt included, and for the first time, began to finish assignments more regularly. When I announced them as "star buddies" in class, his eyes lit up with pride — it gave him a reason to try harder.

Manoj used to sit quietly in the classroom, hesitant to raise his hand, unsure if his answers were right. But small, intentional changes made a difference. I started acknowledging his effort every time he tried, no matter how small the step. Slowly, he began to volunteer a little more, and with each cheer from the class or smile from me, his self-belief started to grow.

Reigniting the Spark

In the month of February, we held another parent meeting — this time with the special educator present. We explained how important consistency was, and the potential Manoj had if he just attended regularly. His parents listened, and this time, they followed through.

Soon after, Manoj started attending support sessions more regularly. Encouraged by his own progress and the attention he was receiving, we began to give him new types of practice—sentence unscrambling, verb tense exercises, and more read aloud. His struggles didn't disappear, but now, his readiness and effort was commendable.

Still Growing, Still Trying

Manoj's journey is far from over. He still has much to work on—writing stronger sentences, remembering grammar rules, and continuing to build his vocabulary. But every effort, every worksheet, and every moment of support is helping him climb higher. He is learning that it's okay

to make mistakes, as long as you keep going.

Manoj may not be the loudest voice in the room, but he is one of the most determined. His story is a reminder that with encouragement, consistency, and a little extra care, every child can bloom at their own pace.

I realized that his hesitation wasn't laziness—it was rooted in self-doubt. I decided to meet him where he was and take small, steady steps forward.

We began with simple reading passages and guided questions. I sat with him, decoding tough phrases and discussing meanings. Slowly, Rohan started engaging. Grammar became part of our daily routine—quick, focused exercises that built his confidence without overwhelming him. Mistakes were treated as learning moments, never as failures.

To help his vocabulary grow, I introduced a small goal: five new words a week. Rohan not only learned them but created his own sentences and maintained a vocabulary journal that he proudly showed off. These little victories began to build his confidence.

By January, I started seeing a different Rohan. He participated in discussions. His voice, once unsure, carried more certainty. But the sample board exams brought new challenges—unfinished papers and difficulty with literature questions. A gentle conversation revealed that he hadn't been reading the chapters fully.

Instead of disappointment, I offered him a plan: read and write short summaries, then we'd meet to shape his responses. I gave him tools—mind maps, question banks, grammar worksheets—to guide him further. And the results began to show.

Rohan's answers grew clearer. He completed his papers. And those quiet feedback sessions turned into conversations full of ideas and learning. He was not just understanding English better; he was beginning to believe in himself.

Learning Experience: Supporting Mast. Hemant's Transition Journey

As a counselor, it is always rewarding to witness the growth and transformation of a child, especially when their journey presents unique challenges. One such case was Mast. Hemant, a young boy transitioning from Junior Kindergarten (Jr. KG) to Senior Kindergarten (Sr. KG). His early struggles in class, particularly with hyperactivity, low sitting tolerance, and aggression, presented an opportunity for intervention and support through counseling, behavioral techniques, and remedial strategies.

Mast. Hemant's class teacher initially referred him to me due to his persistent restlessness and lack of focus. He found it difficult to sit still, often refusing to engage in writing tasks. His behavior was disruptive, and he frequently displayed aggression towards his peers, accompanied by a constant demand for attention and things. Recognizing that this was affecting his academic progress, I began one-on-one counseling sessions with Mast. Hemant, alongside class observations.

Behavioral Techniques Used:

During our sessions, I observed Mast. Hemant closely to identify triggers for his behavior and his preferred coping mechanisms. One of the most effective techniques I used was positive reinforcement. This involved offering rewards for small successes to increase desired behaviors. For example, Mast. Hemant was given reward stars for completing tasks such as writing or coloring. The stars acted as a visual reminder of his accomplishments and motivated him to stay focused on his work. Over time, his ability to stay seated and engage in tasks improved, as he understood that his efforts were acknowledged and rewarded.

Additionally, I utilized differential reinforcement, where I reinforced the behavior, I wanted to see more of (such as staying calm and focusing) and ignored or redirected disruptive behaviors. This helped to gradually diminish the frequency of his aggressive outbursts and increase positive behaviors.

Another key technique I applied was token economy. Mast. Hemant earned tokens for specific actions like sitting quietly, using his materials correctly, and participating in class activities. These tokens could later be exchanged for a variety of rewards, including toys or additional playtime. This technique not only increased Mast. Hemant's motivation but also taught him the value of patience and delayed gratification.

To further support his self-regulation, I incorporated self-monitoring strategies into his routine. Mast. Hemant was encouraged to track his own behavior by using a simple chart that marked his progress in areas like writing and staying seated. This approach gave him more control over his actions and helped him become more aware of his behaviors.

Incorporating Interests for Engagement:

It also became clear that Mast. Hemant responded positively to activities that allowed him to engage his hands. He particularly enjoyed playing with clay, which helped him calm down and focus for longer periods. By incorporating clay play into his daily routine, he was able to build sitting tolerance while providing a calming effect that helped him stay seated and participate in tasks.

Collaboration with the Teacher:

In our sessions, I worked closely with his teacher to integrate calming techniques and mindfulness

practices in the classroom. I recommended guided breathing exercises and visual relaxation cues, such as soft music or a calming corner with sensory tools. These strategies not only helped Mast. Hemant manage his aggression but also supported the entire class in maintaining a peaceful learning environment.

Results and Growth:

By the time he transitioned to Sr. KG, Mast. Hemant had made remarkable progress. His behavior had become more manageable, and his social interactions improved as he learned to express himself more calmly. The combination of behavioral techniques, individualized counseling, and a supportive classroom environment allowed him to develop better attention span, emotional regulation, and academic skills.

Mast. Hemant's story highlights the power of behavioral interventions in helping children navigate challenges. Through positive reinforcement, token economies, self-monitoring, and mindfulness techniques, we were able to address his specific needs and provide a structure that fostered success. Mast. Hemant is now doing well academically, and his interactions with peers have become more positive and meaningful. His journey is a reminder that with the right support and personalized strategies, children can overcome their challenges and thrive.

A Quiet Struggle to Confident Success: Chetan's learning Journey

It was a great experience working closely with Chetan, who was initially shy and reluctant to participate, required a great deal of empathy. I had to put myself in his shoes and understand the source of his anxiety and disengagement. This taught me how essential it is to truly listen to each student and recognize that their struggles may not always be visible or easily understood. I became more patient, realizing that building trust with a student takes time, and progress may be slow but steady. Chetan's initial disengagement in the classroom was a challenge that pushed me to think outside the box. I had to adapt my teaching strategies to better suit his needs. For instance, the idea of encouraging him to take notes and come up with questions for discussion helped me realize how powerful such strategies can be for any student. I now implement more personalized strategies in my classroom, recognizing that every child learns differently and might need a tailored approach to succeed. It reinforced for me the importance of flexibility in my teaching.

This experience reinforced the value of one-on-one teacher-student interactions. While large classroom settings are vital for collaboration and group learning, individual attention can be incredibly powerful in helping a student overcome specific barriers. Through my interactions with Chetan, I learned how impactful these personalized moments can be in fostering trust, addressing concerns directly, and providing individualized support. Now, I make a conscious effort to carve out time for more one-on-one sessions with students who may need extra help, not just academically but emotionally too.

Seeing Chetan's confidence grow as I celebrated his small victories taught me how essential positive reinforcement is in the learning process. By simply acknowledging his efforts, even when his scores weren't perfect, I could see how much it motivated him. This experience made me

reflect on my approach to encouraging students. I now place greater emphasis on celebrating small successes and providing praise that reinforces effort over perfection, which I've found encourages a growth mindset in my students.

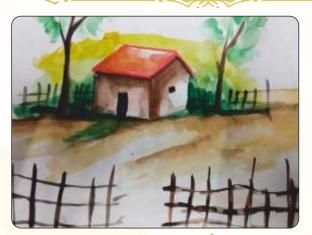
Chetan's initial reluctance to ask questions and engage was rooted in a lack of confidence, something I hadn't fully understood until I worked closely with him. This experience helped me realize how critical, emotional and mental support is in the learning process. A student's academic performance isn't just influenced by their intellectual abilities but also by their mental and emotional well-being. Now, I make a conscious effort to create a classroom environment that feels safe, where students can take risks, make mistakes, and grow without fear of judgment. This experience reminded me that a teacher's role is not only to impart academic knowledge but also to nurture students' personal development. By helping Chetan gain confidence and start participating more in class, I realized that teachers can play a key role in shaping a student's self-esteem and overall growth. This reflection has led me to focus more on developing the "whole child" in my teaching philosophy, encouraging not only academic excellence but also social and emotional growth.

One of the key takeaways from this experience was realizing the power of small, consistent interventions. Encouraging Chetan to take notes and ask questions was a small shift, but it had a profound impact on his learning. This made me reflect on the importance of everyday teaching practices and how even small changes in approach can lead to significant results. It also made me more mindful of the impact I can have on my students simply by offering them small, consistent support and encouragement.

Chetan's transformation confirmed the value of student-centered teaching. By giving him the space to express his doubts and offering personalized strategies, I learned how effective it can be to put the student's needs and preferences at the center of the learning process. The process of guiding Chetan through his difficulties showed me that the best way to help students succeed is by actively involving them in their own learning and empowering them to take ownership. As Chetan began to feel more comfortable approaching me, I also improved my own communication skills. I had to learn how to ask the right questions, listen actively, and provide clear and constructive feedback. This experience enhanced my ability to communicate with students in a way that encourages trust and openness, and skills that I apply in all my interactions with students.

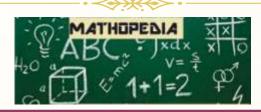
Reflection of Mathopedia

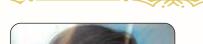
My mentors also guided me and helped throughout the journey. The experience was memorable.

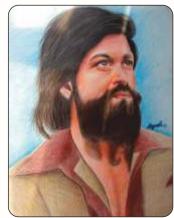

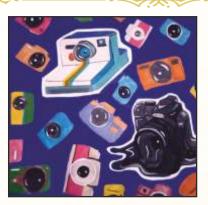

अनेक सामाजिक चळवळीत, सत्याग्रहांमधे सहभाग घेतला. पुढील काळातही त्यांनी नाशिक जिल्ह्यातील आदिवासी विद्यार्थांना शिक्षणासाठी मदत केली. पत्रकारितेच्या निमित्ताने मुंबईत आल्यावर शिरवाडकरांना मुंबई मराठी साहित्य संघाचे डॉ. अ.ना. भालेराव भेटले. मराठी रंगभूमीचा सुवर्णकाळ संपून ती मृतप्राय होऊ नये म्हणून झटणारे भालेराव यांनी कवी शिरवाडकरांना नाटके लिहिण्यास प्रवृत्त केले, केवळ कवी असलेले वि.वा. शिरवाडकर वघता वघता एक यशस्वी नाटककार झाले. कविता, नाटक, कादंबरी, कथा, लघुनिबंध इत्यादी साहित्यप्रकार त्यांनी हाताळले. १० मार्च १९९९ रोजी शिरवाडकरांचे निधन झाले.

डॉ. ए.पी.जे. अब्दुल कलाम हे एक भारतीय शास्त्रज्ञ आणि राजकारणी होते, ज्यांनी २००२ ते २००७ या कालावधीत भारताचे ११वे राष्ट्रपती म्हणून कार्य केले. १९३१ मध्ये तामिळनाडूच्या

रामेश्वरम येथे जन्मलेल्या कलाम यांचे बालपण आर्थिकदृष्ट्या दुर्बल कुटुंबात गेले. अडचणी असूनही, ते एक अतिशय हुशार विद्यार्थी होते आणि पुढे जाऊन ते भारताचे प्रसिद्ध शास्त्रज्ञ आणि क्षेपणास्त्र तंत्रज्ञ बनले.

कलाम यांची वैज्ञानिक कामगिरी अत्यंत महत्त्वाची आहे. त्यामध्ये भारताचे पहिले रुवदेशी उपग्रह प्रक्षेपण वाहन, ध्रुवीय उपग्रह प्रक्षेपण वाहन तसेच अभी आणि पृथ्वी या क्षेपणारत्रांची नििती यांचा समावेश होतो. भारताच्या अण्वस्त्र कार्यक्रमातही त्यांनी मोलाची भूमिका बजावली. त्यांच्या विज्ञान व तंत्रज्ञान क्षेत्रातील योगदानामुळे त्यांना 'भारतरत्न' या सर्वोच्च नागरी सन्'ानासह अनेक पुरस्कारांनी गौरवण्यात आले.

वैज्ञानिक योगदानाबरोबरच डॉ. कलाश हे एक दूरदर्शी नेते आणि युवकांच्या शिक्षणासाठी उत्कट वकील होते. शिक्षणाच्या माध्यमातून समाजात परिवर्तन घडवता येते, असा त्यांचा दृढ विश्वास होता. त्यांनी आपले आयुष्य तरुणांना प्रेरणा देण्यासाठी आणि त्यांना सशक्त करण्यासाठी समर्पित केले. त्यांनी "Wings of Fire" सारखी प्रेरणादायी पुस्तके लिहून आपल्या जीवनातील अनुभव शेअर केले, ज्यामुळे भारतातील आणि जगभरातील लाखो तरुणांना दिशा मिळाली.

वनसंरक्षक यांनी केली. २७ जानेवारी २०२० रोजी स्वित्झर्लंडच्या ग्लांड येथील रामसर सचिवालयातर्फे केंद्र सरकारला याबाबत माहिती देण्यात आली. देशातील आणखी ९ पाणथळांचाही यामध्ये समावेश झाला असून, भारतातील हे ३१ वे जागतिक पाणथळ स्थळ ठरले आहे. यामुळे येत्या काळात वन्यजीव संवर्धन व संरक्षणासह पर्यटन आणि रोजगारवृध्दीसाठी निश्चितच फायदा होणार आहे.

दुर्मिळतेचे रक्षण वनस्पतींपैकी चंदन वृक्ष, देवळाली मिनो हा मासा, पक्ष्यांपैकी छोट्या टिपक्यांचा गरूड, शाही गरूड, छोटी लालसरी, मिशिवाला गवती वटवट्या, पांढऱ्या मानेचा करकोचा, पांढऱ्या पुठ्याचे गिधाड, लांब चोचीचे गिधाड, पांढरे गिधाड आणि विबट्या या दुर्मिळ प्रजाती नांदूरमध्यमेश्वरमध्ये आढळतात. वृक्ष, मासे, पक्षी, प्राणी या सर्व प्रकारातील दुर्मिळ प्रजातीचे येथे संवर्धन होत आहे. माश्यांसाठी खाद्य, अंडनिक्षेपनाच्या जागा, नर्सरी, रनानांतरणचे मार्ग याचा हे अभयारण्य उत्तम स्त्रोत आहे.

<mark>संपन्न जै</mark>वविविधता

नांदूरमध्यमेश्वरमध्ये ७३६ प्रकारच्या जलीय व भूपृष्ठीय वनस्पती आहेत. ८ प्रकारचे सस्तन प्राणी, २६५ प्रकारचे पक्षी. २४ प्रकारचे गोड्या पाण्यातील मासे आणि ४१ प्रकारची फुलपाखरे येथे आहेत. हा परिसर जैवविविधतेने संपन्न असल्याचा महत्त्वपूर्ण निकष रामसर ठरण्यासाठी कामी आला आहे. या ठिकाणी जागतिक संकटग्रस्त देवळाली मिनो हा जगात कोठेही नसलेला मासा आहे. यासह बदर कॅटफिश, स्लेन्डेर रासबोरा, नोवाकुला रेजरबेली मिनो आणि संकटग्रस्त शातिनी बार्ब या प्रजाती येथे आहेत. या ठिकाणी प्रशिक्षित गाईंड असून, २० पेक्षा जास्त अत्याधुनिक दुर्बिण आणि पक्षी निरीक्षणाकरीता मनोरे आहेत.

पक्षी सं[}]लन

जीवनचक्रातील निर्णायक टप्प्यावर आणि प्रतिकूल परिस्थित नांवूरमध्यमेश्वरमध्ये पक्षी व प्राणी आश्य घेतात. हिवाळ्यात या ठिकाणी देशी-विदेशी पक्ष्यांचे संमेलन भरते. सप्टेंबर ते मार्च हा पक्षी संमेलनचा कालावधी असतो. दक्षिण आशियात नियमित हिवाळी स्थलांतर करणाऱ्या एका प्रजातीच्या किंवा उपप्रजातीच्या पक्ष्यांचा यात समावेश आहे. यामध्ये छोटी लालसरी, पांढरा करकोचा, सामान्य क्रांच, चमचा आणि मोर शराटी या पक्ष्यांचा समावेश आहे. शिवाय स्थानिक पक्ष्यांसाठी प्रजननाचे हे ठिकाण आहे. दरवर्षी २० ते ४५ हजार पक्ष्यांचा मुक्काम या अभयारण्यात असतो.

इ.स. १९६० साली बांधले असावे, असा अंवाज अभ्यासक लावतात. हे एकटे मंदिर नसून, शिवपंचायतन स्वरूपात असणारा हा पाच मंदिरांचा समूह आहे. म्हणूनच गोंदेश्वराचे महत्त्व फक्त सिन्नर अथवा नाशिकपुरते मर्यादित नाही तर महाराष्ट्राच्या स्थापत्यशिल्प वैभवात या मंदिराने भर घातलेली आहे. सिन्नर येथील गोंदेश्वर मंदिर हे मंदिर पुरातन भूमिज स्थापत्यशेती बांधकामाचा उत्तम नमुना आहे. हे मंदिर पाच मुख्य मंदिरांचा समूह असल्याने त्याला शैवपंचायतन म्हटले जाते. यांतील गदिश्वराचे मुख्य शिवमंदिर मध्यावर असून सभोवतीची चार उपदिशांना असणारी मंदिरे पार्वती, गणपती, सूर्य आणि विष्णू यांची आहेत.

मंदिराचे मुख्य प्रवेशद्वार पूर्वता असून दक्षिण व उत्तर दिशेलाही प्रवेशद्वार आहे. मंदिराची संरचना स्वर्गमंडप, नंदीमंडप, मुखमंडप, सभामंडप व अंतराळ व गर्भगृह अशी असून गर्भगृहावर बांधलेले, आकाशाकडे झेपावणारे मंदिराचे पटईचे शिखर अतिशय देखणे असून अप्रतिम कोरीवकामाने सजवलेले आहे. गर्भगृहात रेखीव शिवपिंड आहे. मंदिराला विस्तृत आवार आहे.

युवा एक महान संपत्ती

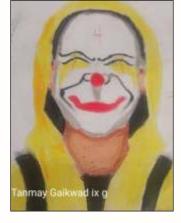
